

"In addition, our churches were able to purchase food and snack packs for children who were at home during the pandemic and they were able to provide utility assistance to families in OIMC."

"We are blessed with the connectional network of The United Methodist Church and the many great organizations beyond that have allowed us to serve our Native community in this time of need," said Wilson.
