### LET THE CHILDREN COME

"God's kingdom belongs to people like these children."

Mark 10:14, CEB

### INTRODUCTION

Do you know the song "Jesus Loves the Little Children"? Let's sing it together (if singing is not advisable yet, listen to a recording instead. Please note the lyrics have been updated):

Jesus loves the little children All the children of the world

Every child in every land

Jesus holds them in His hand

Jesus loves the little children of the world.

This song is based on a time that Jesus welcomed the children to him (Mark 10:13-16 CEB).

People were bringing children to Jesus so that he would bless them. But the disciples scolded them. When Jesus saw this, he grew angry and said to them, "Allow the children to come to me. Don't forbid them, because God's kingdom belongs to people like these children. I assure you that whoever doesn't welcome God's kingdom like a child will never enter it." Then he hugged the children and blessed them.

Today in our church we observe World Communion Sunday. We remember the special meal that Jesus shared with his friends. (Hold up the paper plate.)

We also remember how Jesus' love is shared with and through people all over the world. Our church family includes children and adults from around the globe. (Hold up map or globe.) We will join with other churches to help support the dreams of young leaders who are building up God's kingdom.

For example, in Brazil (point to Brazil on the globe) Cleber Lizardo de Assis works with children and teenagers to help them have a better life. In this photo (show photo), he is playing music for children and sharing his new children's book. When he wanted to go to school to learn about ways to help the children in the community, he was concerned that he didn't have enough money. But because of a World Communion Sunday scholarship, he was able to receive the education that will help him be a stronger leader (full story here: https://umcmission.org/reconciliation/world-communion-scholar-puts-the-social-in-social-science/).

### Craft

Say, "As part of our World Communion Sunday activity today we are going to create a 'Jesus loves the little children of the world' craft."


