THE SABBATH

(IT WAS MADE FOR US FOR A REASON)

If the expectations/workload for your position cannot be achieved in the time you can give to it while still practicing Sabbath, then something needs to be adjusted.

- Get better or faster at something.
- Rearrange how you do some tasks.
- Recruit, develop and delegate.
- Readjust the expectations and workload.



MINISTRY IS NOT PREDICTABLE

Ministry is full of interruptions. Don't allow the urgent to drown out the important. Some interruptions actually keep you from functioning at your best. Others need our full attention.

WITH MARGIN IN YOUR SCHEDULE: You are more likely to feel you have time to explore an idea or take advantage of

YOUR BRAIN NEEDS TIME AND SPACE TO BE CREATIVE

When there is nothing intensive on which to focus, the brain can do its thing. Unstructured time is when the magic happens.

Give your creative brain the margin it needs to do intangible things it can only do in unstructured time.
