n United Methodist Student Day, we partner with other congregations in a special offering to support the next generation of young disciples on their educational journeys.

Dating back to 1872, the General Conference established the first special day with offerings with the Methodist Episcopal Sunday School Children's Offering for Education. The United Methodist Church recognizes that educating children was and still is a strong investment in the future of the church. The Special Sunday was established as a Children's Fund and in 1940 was renamed Student Day. Initially, this Sunday was observed in June, but since 1968 it is celebrated on the last Sunday in November.

One of the denomination's six special offerings, United Methodist Student Day celebrates young adults and gives them a financial and spiritual boost. At a time when students are emerging from a pandemic and experiencing the fracturing of their denomination, while preparing themselves to be leaders, we can be a source of encouragement.
