Half of the gifts from the Peace with Justice Sunday special offering stay with local ministries in this conference and half support the work of Church and Society globally. 2023 grant recipients include:

- The Asuncion A. Perez Memorial Center, Inc., located in the Manila Episcopal Area Central Conference, is providing "Skills Training & Livelihood for Women." This initiative empowers women who have been affected by massive worker layoffs, providing them with the necessary skills for employment while also addressing food insecurity.
- In the Central Congo Central Conference, the Church and Society Committee initiated the "Space for Community Dialogue for Peace in District" project. This endeavor is a response to ethnic conflicts over ancestral lands. The organization is establishing a platform

for dialogue, creating an environment for lasting peace and effective governance.


