



REGIONALIZATION AS SOLUTION



REGIONALIZATION AS THEOLOGICAL CONCEPT

- **Regionalization**: the primary venue for making collective decisions for the church should be a regional level.
- **Contextualization**: the practices of the church should be determined within a shared context.

DIFFERENT LEVELS



WORLDWIDE REGIONALIZATION LEGISLATION

Existing central conferences become regional conferences.

A new U.S. regional conference is created.

Each regional conference can adapt portions of the BOD.

All regional conferences share portions of the BOD.

The Council of Bishops, Judicial Council, general agencies & General Conference are maintained.


